STOCK MARKET REPORT

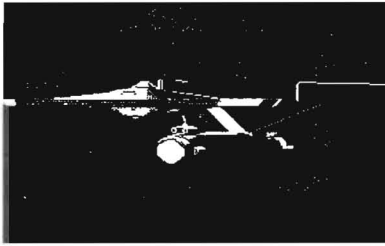
