Suicide is the tenth leading cause of death and rising alarmingly among adolescents in the United States. Charged with guilt and the inevitable question 'Why?,' suicide is an irrevocable act that leaves an aftermath of complex emotions and unanswered questions. In addition to offering an intriguing look at what the dead themselves say about suicide, its consequences, and their experiences in the afterlife, **Suicide: What Really Happens in the Afterlife?** brings together every kind of suicide scenario for the first time in a single book—traditional suicide, assisted suicide, and suicide mass murder adopted by terrorism. Specific chapters describe the cultural history of channeling and suicide, why people say they take their own lives, what it means to cross over, adjusting to the afterlife, what suicides would like to say to those left behind, and what they would tell others who are contemplating suicide.
